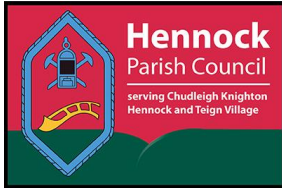


COVID-19 SPECIFIC CHUDLEIGH KNIGHTON PLAY PARK RISK ASSESSMENT

<p>Spread of Covid-19 (Coronavirus)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Contractors (Play Park inspectors) Employee (Clerk) • Children • Vulnerable groups – elderly (supervising children) & those with existing underlying health conditions • Anyone else who physically comes in contact with the play equipment 	<p>Timing of Play Park inspections</p> <p>Wearing of gloves by Play Park Inspector & Clerk</p> <p>Face coverings</p> <p>Provision of stewards</p> <p>Arrange a booking system</p> <p>Relocate equipment for social distancing</p>	<p>The Play Park inspector will carry out inspections early in the morning when there is less likely to be people there</p> <p>The Play Park inspector (& Clerk when visiting the Play Park) will wear gloves - as the risk of Covid-19 transmission is not considered a “very high risk” the role of PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) in providing additional protection is extremely limited</p> <p>There is a lower risk of spreading coronavirus outdoors - the wearing of face coverings is not compulsory and will be left to the individual’s discretion</p> <p>It is not feasible for the Parish Council to provide stewards</p> <p>It is not feasible for the Parish Council to arrange a booking system – signage states: If the play area is busy, please come back later</p> <p>It is not feasible for the Parish Council to relocate equipment – signage states: Please keep your distance A maximum of 2 adults per family unit All items of equipment should only be used by one family unit at a time Do not use any equipment marked out of use</p>

		Clean equipment daily & provide cleaning equipment	It is not feasible for the Parish Council to clean the equipment daily – signage states: This play area has been safety inspected but cannot be guaranteed to be coronavirus (Covid-19) free Anyone experiencing symptoms of coronavirus (Covid-19) must not enter this play area Adults should provide regular hand sanitisation
		Create a one-way system	It is not feasible for the Parish Council to create a one-way system – signage states: Please follow this advice to ensure everyone’s safety
		Refuse	Signage states: Use litter bins provided or take it home with you No food or drink

Assessment date: 14th July 2020 & updated 22nd July 2020

Review date: 13th October 2020 - If the Covid-19 situation changes and restrictions tighten, the Council may have to close the play parks again.
